1. VIRGIL "GUS" GRISSOM MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP/ PURDUE ALUMNI CLUB

- The Purdue Alumni Club will be awarding four scholarships locally in the amount of \$1000 each this spring. The scholarships have been named in honor of Lieutenant Colonel Gus Grissom, who was a Purdue Alumnus and astronaut from Southern Indiana.

19. KIMBALL INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Kimball International Scholarship Program is administered by The Kimball International-Habig Foundation.
